Canoe Polo (Annual) Report

In 2024/25, BGCC was represented in polo at three Summer Series events, Nationals, Oceanias and three regional competitions, criss-crossing our way across Australia from Adelaide to Hobart to the Gold Coast.

The part-ACT team, the Butterflies, featuring myself, Carley Goodwin and in one comp Jess Harmer, was our most successful team for Summer Series, placing in all three Summer Series events, including two wins.

At the inaugural Hobart Invitational, myself again and Matty Gates, making a special one-off canoe polo appearance for the year, took out the Open Division, with Bane Burr winning Division 2. We also had BGCC member, Louise Gates, in the winning team for the Mudcake Challenge and alongside me our club President, Laura Kleinrahm, won the Nambucca Header.

To cap off the domestic season, BGCC held the National and Oceanias Championships. ACT entered teams in U18s, U21s, Senior Men's and Women's and O45s. Facing strong competition, bolstered by visiting Kiwi players, it wasn't ACT's finest year, however our Senior Men's team brought some saving grace for BGCC, scoring a bronze after narrow 1 goal losses to the top two teams.

Straight after, we had several representatives in the Australian Teams for the Oceania Championships. It's always a hard fight against our Trans-Tasman counterparts, who have multiple dedicated polo clubs and one with over 700 members.

So, it was exciting to have two wins in categories that hadn't experienced wins in over a decade. Jess Harmer, coached by James Harmer, was part of the triumphant U21 Women's Team and me in the winning Senior Men's team.

We also levelled up on our ICF accreditations, I became an ICF Level C Referee and Laura Kleinrahm and David Burr ICF Officials.

More locally, polo games or training have run nearly every week of the year. With only the very occasional low numbers or holiday period calling it off. Which for our little squad of just over 40 shows their dedication. So, thank-you to all that contribute to the awesome polo community we have within this club.

the King River as well.

Then while studying, I worked as a guide with a few companies running commercial tours on the Ovens through Bright and running night tours on the Yarra through Melbourne CBD.

With BGCC, I have been enjoying Sunday morning paddles on the lake, usually in one of the V8s. I am also keen to attend and contribute to the growing white-water discipline at the club. I am excited to explore the new local rivers around the region and abroad.

Recipes from the AGM.

[I enjoyed sampling some of our members' culinary skills, so here are a couple of their recipes; and sorry - I didn't take any photos! Editor]

Current recipe adapted from "Inside/Out" Jul/Aug 2008:

Tian of Eggplant, Capsicum and Zucchini

Serves 8

250ml extra virgin olive oil

4 medium eggplants, 6mm thick, sliced lengthwise, see method below*

3 large red capsicums, see method below

4 medium zucchinis, 8mm thick, sliced lengthwise

375ml Dolmio Basil & Garlic Tomato sauce

4 Bocconcini coarsely grated

1 Tbsp fresh oregano or rigani

125g finely grated Grana Padano

Ground black pepper

75ml verjuice & 75ml e.v. olive oil mixed to coat eggplant

Method:

Preheat fan forced oven to 220°C.

Coat capsicums with olive oil

Roast whole capsicums at 220° till at least 60% skin is blackened* (20-25min)

Remove from oven, place in bowl, cover with plastic film

Allow to cool and remove skin

Remove seeds and membrane and cut into 30-40mm strips and drain on kitchen paper

Coat both sides of eggplant sliced with verjuice/oil mixture

Roast at 200-220⁰, turning to brown both sides

Drain on kitchen paper

Oil a 300mm x 200mm ceramic baking dish

Place one layer of drained eggplant along base

Spread some pasta sauce, grated bocconcini, parmesan, a generous scatter of oregano and black pepper over

Place one layer of capsicum strips over sauce mixture followed by one layer of zucchini and sauce mixture

Repeat the layering, finishing with the zucchini, drizzle of oil and grated cheese.

Preheat fan forced oven to 175°C

Bake the tian for 40min or until all vegetables are tender

Let rest for 20min before serving

Bon Appetit - David Gordon

Jen's Choc Ginger Brownie (gluten free)

The base recipe came from the Cadbury chocolate cookbook but has been extensively modified to deserve the title. It is a quick and easy recipe that I make regularly enough that I don't need to check the recipe.

125 g butter

1/4 cup dark cocoa

1 tsp vanilla

½ cup brown sugar

1/4 cup white sugar

3/4 cup ground almonds

1/4 cup gluten free plain flour

½ tsp gluten free baking powder

1 egg

1/4 cup chopped walnuts

1/4 cup chopped glace ginger

Method:

Cream butter and cocoa; mix in vanilla and sugar. Add almonds, flour and baking powder, egg, walnuts and ginger.

Spread into lined or greased 18cm tin and bake for about 20 minutes at 180 degrees Celsius until just set - do not overcook.

(can be dairy free spread to make gluten free/dairy free but texture is softer)

You can also add a handful of dark baking chocolate (or white if that takes your fancy) and swap walnuts for macadamias or pecans. It is better if you can wait, refrigerate for a few hours, otherwise serve hot and gooey with ice-cream @



Paddle 2025 Marathon Series



LBG depth going down...



Construction on major strengthening upgrades at Scrivener Dam is underway. This project bulletin provides an update on progress since construction began in April 2025.

What are we doing?

This project is about strengthening the downstream structure of the dam known as the dissipator. It is a concrete structure which absorbs the energy of the water flowing over the flood gates and prevents potentially damaging erosion in the river channel downstream of the dam.

Construction began in April 2025 and is expected to be complete in mid-2027 (weather permitting).

Progress update

Over the last 4 months we have:

- established the site compound and constructed temporary access roads into the river channel
- completed the cofferdam (a temporary dam to create a dry area for construction work)
- started removing the existing baffle blocks (concrete teeth in the bottom of the dissipator) and preparing the surface of the old concrete for the new concrete slab.

And in the last week we have commenced drilling and installing test anchors into the foundation rock beneath the dam.
